SUBJECT: Budget Amendment KFD Overtime Account – NAS-K Wings Over Texas Airshow

#### Summary:

The Kingsville Fire Department is requesting a budget amendment to the department's Overtime Account (001-5-220.0-1120.0) in the amount of \$1,330.00. The request comes due to insufficient funding planned to cover a request to support the NAS-Kingsville Wings Over Texas Airshow, March 24-25, 2018. The request comes from the NAS-Kingsville FD for additional fire, rescue, and EMS coverage over the two-day event. If approved, the KFD will support the event by providing a fully staffed Engine, MICU, and roving medic units throughout the duration of the event.

### Background:

The following event is a recurring event that has been supported in the past and recurs every two years. By doing so, our department will provide additional fire, rescue, and EMS support to our NAS-Kingsville FD neighbors.

Lastly, the event is scheduled over two days and personnel will be working approximately ten (10) hour days, each day for a total of twenty (20) hours over the duration of the event.

#### **Financial Impact:**

In reviewing our current budgeted amount of \$3,100.00 for this event and conferring with our Finance Department, it was determined that an additional \$1,330.00 would have to be added for a total of \$4,430.00 to cover OT and benefits of our personnel during the event.

#### Recommendation:

The following budget amendment request supports the goals set by the Kingsville Fire Department to continue to support the NAS-Kingsville FD during the Wings Over Texas Airshow. Our recommendation is that the Commission approve the budget request, so we may continue to support this event as we have in the past.

SUBJECT: Sponsorship Agreement for the 2018 Wings Over South Texas Airshow

#### **Summary:**

This item authorizes the City Manager to enter into a sponsorship agreement with NAS-Kingsville Moral, Welfare & Recreation Department in the amount of \$3,000 for the 2018 Wings Over South Texas Airshow to be held on March 24 -25, 2018.

### Background:

The Wings Over South Texas Airshow has a tremendous economic impact to Kingsville. This impact comes in the form of increased Hotel Occupancy Tax Dollars and Sales Tax revenue generated by the nearly 100,000 people that visit Kingsville over the event weekend.

The City of Kingsville has been a partner of the air show for a long time with in kind assistance which the City continues to do so for this air show. However, the City now has an opportunity to be a cash sponsor of the event as well. Being a cash sponsor allows the City to receive more recognition for this partnership relationship. This specific sponsorship level for \$3,000 comes with logos, ads, exhibit space and hospitality advantages that include 10 seats in the platinum tent, 5 sponsor parking passes, complimentary shuttle service to flightline form Sponsor lot, Early access to Wings of Gold Tent ticket sales and 5 tickets to the Sponsor Appreciation Party.

#### **Financial Impact:**

\$3,000 to be split between the General Fund and Tourism Funds (\$1,500/ea.)

From that discussion and my research I have come up with a definition and a recommendation for its location when it comes to where it would not be allowed, permitted or a special use permit is required.

**Financial Impact:** I think the financial impact would be a positive one for the use of a vacant space for a business, sales tax and an entertainment type niche that is desired for our community.

**Recommendation:** The Planning and Zoning Commission will be meeting to make a recommendation on the definition of a brewpub and where it can be located. While you will see a microbrewery mentioned it was determined that it was best to concentrate on a brewpub first and work on the other type of establishments in the future.

Subject: Agenda items concerning Brewpubs

At our last meeting we discussed brewpubs with a potential owner present to talk about what his plan was for the business. We also talked about what makes them different from other like businesses and where they should be located. Here is my recommendation for the two items that would allow us to go forward with this request.

I have given you examples of definitions in a previous packet. From those examples, I would like to suggest the following:

### Brewpub

An establishment which holds a valid permit from the Texas Alcohol Beverage Control Board for the manufacture, processing and packaging of alcoholic beverages. Can make and sell beer on site to sell off and on site. Can self-distribute to stores and bars. Can sell other beers for onsite consumption but only their own beer to go. Limited to 10,000 barrels a year in production.

In the example that was given to us if a food truck is utilized then the food truck ordinance would be used comparing to what they would want to do.

1. As you recall I distributed information to you about this subject matter. Please review this information. The first thing to understand is how these uses are defined. There are two sources of definitions, one that I have found through research through the Planners Dictionary and one that TABC uses. The one that TABC uses is in the document that I have is included is in the packet(which has an asterisk next to it). There is also a table that shows the differences. I would like to add one more definition to the list of two and that is the definition of a microbrewery Microbrewery is a facility for the production and packaging of malt beverages of low alcoholic content for distribution, retail or wholesale, on or off premise, with a capacity of not more than 15,000 barrels per year. The development may include the uses such as a standard restaurant, bar or live entertainment as otherwise permitted in the zoning district. As you review the differences of the three the microbrewery would be able to brew more beer than a brewpub but not as much as a brewery.

The next thing is to give you an idea of where related uses are allowed in Kingsville. So I have broken these into two categories uses related to a brew pub, microbrewery and a brewery.

### Related uses to a brewpub and a microbrewery

Restaurant: Special use in C1, Permitted in C2, C3, C4, I1 and I2

Package Liquor: Special use in C1, C2 Permitted in C3 C4

Tavern: Special Use in C1, C2 Permitted in C3, C4

Dance Hall, Night Club: Special use in C2 Permitted in C3, C4, I1

#### Related uses to a brewery

Bakery, Wholesale: Special use in C3, Permitted in C4, I1

Cabinet, Furniture Upholstery Shop: Permitted in C2, C3, C4, I1, I2

Cleaning Laundry: Special Use C3, Permitted C3, C4, I1

# Code of Ordinances for the City of Nacodogches, TX

### Definition of Microbrewery: Means a business which:

- 1. Operates under a manufacturer's license as described in VTCA Alcoholic Beverage Code Chapter 62 issues by the TABC
- 2. May operate, but is not required to operate under a brewer's permit as described in VTCA ABC Chapter 12 issued by the TABC
- 3. Has a total maximum production per year of beer, malt liquor and ale of not more than 15,000 barrels (465,000 standard gallons)
- 4. Does not produce or generate any generally obnoxious odors

ORDINANCE	NO.201	8-
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AMENDING THE CITY OF KINGSVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING SECTION 15-6-21-DEFINITIONS TO INCLUDE A DEFINITION FOR BREWPUB; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, the City received a request from an individual in the community who is interested in establishing a brewpub, but there is no suitable definition for a brewpub or related zoning designations;

WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission considered this request at a publicly posted meeting on February 21, 2018 and voted the changes stated herein;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is necessary to protect the public safety, health, and welfare of the City of Kingsville.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KINGSVILLE BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KINGSVILLE, TEXAS:

I.

**THAT** Sections 15-6-21 of Article 6: Zoning of Chapter XV, Land Usage, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kingsville, Texas, shall be amended to read as follows:

#### § 15-6-21 DEFINITIONS.

Since there is brewing on site and the delivery of products it makes it different than a bar or a tavern. In this case if food is involved they often use food trucks to do that. He has looked at a site in the 5 points area on 14<sup>th</sup>. From that discussion and my research I have come up with a definition and a recommendation for its location when it comes to where it would not be allowed, permitted or a special use permit is required.

**Financial Impact:** I think the financial impact would be a positive one for the use of a vacant space for a business, sales tax and an entertainment type niche that is desired for our community.



**Recommendation:** The Planning and Zoning Commission met on Thursday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> and voted 4 to 0 to make a recommendation to approve the definition of a brewpub as cited in the ordinance and to where brewpubs will be allowed as shown in the ordinance.

At our last meeting we discussed brewpubs with a potential owner present to talk about what his plan was for the business. We also talked about what makes them different from other like businesses and where they should be located. Here is my recommendation for the two items that would allow us to go forward with this request.

I have given you examples of definitions in a previous packet. From those examples, I would like to suggest the following:

### Brewpub

An establishment which holds a valid permit from the Texas Alcohol Beverage Control Board for the manufacture, processing and packaging of alcoholic beverages. Can make and sell beer on site to sell off and on site. Can self-distribute to stores and bars. Can sell other beers for onsite consumption but only their own beer to go. Limited to 10,000 barrels a year in production.

In the example that was given to us if a food truck is utilized then the food truck ordinance would be used comparing to what they would want to do.

1. As you recall I distributed information to you about this subject matter. Please review this information. The first thing to understand is how these uses are defined. There are two sources of definitions, one that I have found through research through the Planners Dictionary and one that TABC uses. The one that TABC uses is in the document that I have is included is in the packet(which has an asterisk next to it). There is also a table that shows the differences. I would like to add one more definition to the list of two and that is the definition of a microbrewery Microbrewery is a facility for the production and packaging of malt beverages of low alcoholic content for distribution, retail or wholesale, on or off premise, with a capacity of not more than 15,000 barrels per year. The development may include the uses such as a standard restaurant, bar or live entertainment as otherwise permitted in the zoning district. As you review the differences of the three the microbrewery would be able to brew more beer than a brewpub but not as much as a brewery.

The next thing is to give you an idea of where related uses are allowed in Kingsville. So I have broken these into two categories uses related to a brew pub, microbrewery and a brewery.

### Related uses to a brewpub and a microbrewery

Restaurant: Special use in C1, Permitted in C2, C3, C4, I1 and I2

Package Liquor: Special use in C1, C2 Permitted in C3 C4

Tavern: Special Use in C1, C2 Permitted in C3, C4

Dance Hall, Night Club: Special use in C2 Permitted in C3, C4, I1

Related uses to a brewery

Bakery, Wholesale: Special use in C3, Permitted in C4, I1

Cabinet, Furniture Upholstery Shop: Permitted in C2, C3, C4, I1, I2

Cleaning Laundry: Special Use C3, Permitted C3, C4, I1

### Code of Ordinances for the City of Nacodogches, TX

Definition of Microbrewery: Means a business which:

- 1. Operates under a manufacturer's license as described in VTCA Alcoholic Beverage Code Chapter 62 issues by the TABC
