Honorable Mayor, City Commission, and Residents of Kingsville:

The Monthly Performance and Activity Report provides a snapshot of the operations of our City Departments. Data tracked includes departmental 'Key Performance Indicators' (KPI)'s which are utilized to track our progress in these areas and compare them to months and years prior. This data helps us bring awareness and attention to areas that are not trending in the right direction. Below you will find a summary of the analysis of the data. Additionally, the report includes Key Updates that aim at showcasing the progress the City is making.

### Animal Control

- 1. Dog *reclaims*, *adoptions*, and *euthanizations* are on an upward trend from 2017, while *rescues* are on a downward trend.
- 2. Cat *reclaims*, *adoptions*, and *euthanizations* are on an upward trend from 2017, while *rescues* are on a downward trend.
- 3. Staff installed 4-30" oscillating fans at the animal control shelter to help keep our sheltered dog cool and keep air circulating through the shelter.



4. The street department crews repaired pot holes in some areas of the parking lot of the City-County Health Department.





- 5. The City-County Health Department, contracted A.D.S (Acoustic Door Specialist Inc.) of Corpus Christi, Texas to install a new metal door and frame for the cat room in the animal shelter. The replaced door was over 30 years old, rusty, bent, and had become a safety issue for staff. The new door opens easily and is very nice.
  - a. This is the first door replaced this year, with two replaced last year and two prior to that. Three more metal doors require replacement.



### Community Appearance

- 1. Code enforcement (a) *notices sent*, (b) *inspections*, and (c) *reinspection's* are on an upward trend from 2017, while *abatements* are on a downward trend.
- 2. Recycling of *cardboard* is on an upward trend from 2017, while other *recyclables* (paper, plastic, & aluminum) is on a downward trend.
- 3. Began a program where inspectors performed a sweep of a zone before brush crews begin their collection. Zone 2 & 3 have been completed in May, and half of the city has been inspected. The two inspectors teamed-up for a brush zone sweep, a knock-and-talk approach leaving door-hangers (or placards for vacant lots) to inform the property owner:
  - a. Of a violation.
  - b. When brush crews will be in that area.
  - c. How to take advantage of these city services.



- 4. 67 Abatements were completed, including the mowing of grass and clearing out junk and debris.
  - a. A multi-departmental cleanup occurred at the property located at 919 W AVE I (pictured below). Inspectors and operators teamed up with brush crew and enlisted the assistance of NIO Officer Perez.

#### Downtown

- 1. The first two quarterly Main Street Report's show that *building rehabs*, *business starts and expansions*, and *jobs created* are on a downward trend from 2017.
- 2. Historic District *total permits*, and *demolition permits* are on a downward trend from 2017, while *new construction permits* are on an upward trend.



- 3. The evening of May 17th, Main Street hosted an 'Imagine the Possibilities Tour' of Downtown buildings for sale or rent thanks to a 21-community program of the Texas Historical Commission.
  - a. After a reception, a group of about 20 took a walking tour of ten buildings.
  - b. These properties were also and continue to be featured on THC's DowntownTX.org website for showcase.
    - i. Because of the tour, the property @ 400 E Kleberg Ave is under contract.



4. The public restrooms in the restored pump house were opened for the first time to serve those attending the May 28th Farmers Market. Members of the Kingsville Volunteer Fire Dept. were on hand during the market to provide access to and promote the fact that their 1909 fire engine is on display at the pump house for all to see.





- 5. In honor of May Preservation Month, the Historical Development Board selected two projects out of many reviewed for the Good Stewardship Award. This award recognizes outstanding work in the restoration of/ or for new construction in the Historic District.
  - a. This year's awards went to Rogelio & Maria Esqueda for construction of new residence @ 315 E Lee Ave. (see below photo), and to Mary Lou & Tony Gonzalez for the construction of a covered patio behind their business @ 228 E Kleberg Ave.



### Fire Department

- 1. Call volumes for EMS and fire/first response are on pace with 2017.
- 2. *Response times* are on-average 7% faster than 2017.
- 3. Attended the Coastal Bend Hurricane Conference.
- 4. Completed Hose & Ladder Testing.
- 5. The Compliance Engine went Live on May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 6. 'Brush 2' was placed into Service.
- 7. Completed ICS 100 Training for employees.



- 8. Private Ambulance Inspections:
  - a. Sensible EMS 100% Compliant.
  - b. Air Med EMS 95% Compliant (Lacking driver attendant permits and ID's).
  - c. EMS Direct 0% Compliant (Lacking app. fees, inspections, driver attend. permits).
  - d. Certified letters have been sent, and after 30 days non-compliant EMS Services will accrue a \$200 per-day penalty.

### Municipal Court

### Police Department

- 1. *Violent crime* and *property crime* are both trending downwards from 2017.
- 2. Average *total response time* and *dispatch time* are faster than 2017, while *officer response time* is slower.
- 3. May 13-19 was National Police Week, Chief Torres, Sr. Ptlm. Eric Perez, Ptlm. George Vega, Communication Supervisor Monica Flores and Admin Assistant II Corina Gonzales gave a presentation about bullying to: (a) St. Gertrude School, (b) Kleberg Elementary, (c) Harrel Elementary, (d) A.D. Harvey Elementary, and, (e) Santa Gertrudis Elementary.



4. Telecommunications operator Peggy Garcia passed her Telecommunication State Exam and is now a licensed Telecommunication Operator.



- 5. Lt. Julian Cavazos, IT Noe Sosa, and telecommunication supervisor Monica Flores attended the 2018 Hurricane Conference to help prepare for the upcoming hurricane season.
- 6. On 05-19-18, the Street Level Operations team and the PD SWAT team conducted a narcotics search warrant @ 1424 East Alice. Joel Vela was arrested for Manufacture/ Delivery of a Controlled Substance, and Possession of a Controlled Substance. Vela was charged for these offenses after approximately 9.7 grams of methamphetamine, and 2.1 grams of crushed Xanax were located in his bedroom. Sofia Saenz whom was visiting Vela during the time the search warrant, was also arrested for Possession of a Prohibited Weapon Knuckles after a pair of brass knuckles were in a bag which she claimed was hers.
- 7. On 05-21-18, Inv. A. Ruiz #26 was working criminal interdiction on US Highway 77 when he received a hit on his license plate reader advising of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle which had been reported stolen out of San Antonio, was recovered by Inv. Ruiz. It was discovered during the investigation that this female operating the vehicle had made multiple trips on separate occasions with other vehicles that were possibly stolen. Inv. Ruiz was able to obtain information on the boyfriend of the operator, whom is currently under investigation by Homeland Security for a role in transporting stolen vehicles to Mexico.
- 8. On 05-22-18, Inv. D. Gonzalez #27 was working criminal interdiction of US Highway 77 when he received a hit on his license plate reader advising of a wanted subject. The officer was able to conduct a probable cause traffic stop on the vehicle after observing the subject, Eustolio Roberto Carmona operating the vehicle. Inv. Gonzalez arrested Carmona for 21 active Theft warrants out of Kleberg County. During the investigation, a bag containing approximately 14 grams of synthetic marijuana was in a soiled diaper. Carmona also took responsibility for the synthetic marijuana and was subsequently charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance.
- 9. On 05-22-18, Inv. D. Gonzalez #27 taught a CRASE course for Crime Stoppers at the HEB Center.
- 10. On 05-24-28, Inv. D. Gonzalez #27 assisted Cpl. J. Aleman #65 with instructing the Defensive Tactics Class for the Kingsville Police Department trainees at the Kingsville Boxing Club.

### Public Works

- 1. Garage *oil changes* are trending downward from 2017, while *tire maintenance* is trending upwards. *Un-scheduled service* is trending upwards from 2017, while *scheduled service* is trending downwards.
- 2. Sanitation *damaged roll-outs* are trending upwards from 2017, while *new accounts* are trending downwards.
- 3. Solid waste *customers* are up 95% from 2017. *Residential waste* is trending upwards from 2017, while *commercial waste* and *outside waste* are trending downwards. *City construction & demolition* waste (C&D) is trending sharply upwards from 2017, while *commercial C&D*, *residential C&D*, and *total brush* is trending downwards.



- 4. Wastewater *new lines* are trending upwards from 2017, while *lines replaced*, and *lines cleared* are trending downwards. *Sewer repairs* and *sewer back-ups* are trending upwards from 2017.
- 5. Water *main breaks*, *meter leaks*, and *service leaks* are trending downwards from 2017. *Well production* is on-pace with 2017, while *South Texas Water Authority Production* (STWA) is on a downward trend.
- 6. Wastewater crews will be working on replacing a sewer main line on the 500 block of west Nettie.

<u>Tourism</u>

- Metrics for this department are for the previous month, as the process requires to collect them. \*
- 1. Hotel Occupancy Tax revenues were down about 2% for the month of April compared to 2017, a difference of \$1,290.
- 2. Director Janine Reyes joined the King Ranch sponsored Green Jay Groupies team for the Great Texas Birding Classic. The team competed in the 'sunrise to noon' category identifying a total of 104 species, placing 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 16 teams. Tourism made use of Great Texas Birding Classic hashtags and featured the competition on Facebook and Instagram.





- 3. Promoted National Travel & Tourism Week on Instagram.
  - a. This year's theme was 'Then and Now'.



- 4. On May 17<sup>th</sup>, Tourism helped Cynthia Martin promote and host the 'Imagine the Possibilities tour,' an initiative by the Texas Historical Commission to help showcase and sell underutilized spaces in historic downtown districts. There were about 20-25 people in attendance. We were able to coordinate local media coverage on KRIS 6 News. You can watch the story <u>here</u>.
- 5. Tourism Services Director Janine Reyes emceed the Miss Kingsville, Jr Miss Kingsville and Little Miss Princess Kingsville pageant on May 20<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Pro Tem. Edna Lopez crowned the winners.



6. The Kingsville Gypsys brought fellow motorcycle club members from all over the world to the JK Northway for their annual gathering. Organizers rented the expo center and the RV spots on site. There were no issues and we collected \$4800 in JK Northway Rental Fees and \$1950 in RV rentals.



 Social Media update: Facebook followers are up from 2267 on May 1 to 2370 May 31. Largest video reach this month – 6,700 on May 30<sup>th</sup>. Instagram is up to 441 followers.

### Utility Billing & Meter Reading

- 1. Service orders for *new service*, *disconnects*, *leak checks*, and *failed meters* are on a downward trend from 2017.
- 2. Billing *statements issued*, *late notices*, and *disconnects* are trending slightly downward from 2017.
- 3. Payments by *cash*, *credit cards*, *checks & money orders*, via *online*, and *electronic funds transfers* & *other* are trending downward from 2017, while payments via the *service network* are trending sharply upwards.
- 4. At the beginning of May, a new Beacon software was installed for Meter Reading.
  - a. Staff attended an in house two-day training session on May 3-4, 2018.
