The applicants approached the department because they wanted to re-zone the existing property (HOFFMAN ADDITION BLOCK 7, LOT 20 – 21) from C4 (Commercial) to R1 (Single-Family Residential).

A look into history revealed the property was originally zoned R1(Single-family Residential) prior to 03/10/2014 when the City Commission passed a resolution to rezone the property to C4 to facilitate an extension of a car lot/auto sales shop that occupied the property adjoining the subject property known as 1330 S 6t Street. This is part of a larger lot (lots 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21) that had 3 of the lots rezoned to R1 from C4 earlier this year. This application seeks to complete the rezoning of the remaining 2 lots.

Consequently, this application is being submitted for your consideration. Therefore, it is recommended that you consider the said application and approve same since this will encourage infill development that would provide suitable housing for residents of Kingsville.



ORDINANCE #2022-

AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE BY CHANGING THE ZONING MAP IN REFERENCE TO HOFFMAN ADDITION, BLOCK 7, LOT 20-21, ALSO KNOWN AS 200 BLOCK E. MILLER, KINGSVILLE, TEXAS, FROM C4 (COMMERCIAL DISTRICT) TO R1 (SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT); AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO ACCOUNT FOR ANY DEVIATIONS FROM THE EXISTING COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has forwarded to the City Commission its reports and recommendations concerning the application of William Dove & Associates LLC, authorized agent for owner/applicant Chuck Cramer, for amendment to the zoning ordinance and zoning map of the City of Kingsville;

WHEREAS, with proper notice to the public, public hearings were held on Wednesday, May 4, 2022 during a meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission, and on Monday, May 9, 2022 during a meeting of the City Commission, at City Hall, in the City of Kingsville, during which all interested persons were allowed to appear and be heard; and

WHEREAS, the item was APPROVED with a 5-0 vote of the Planning Commission regarding the requested rezone with no abstentions; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that this amendment would best serve public health, necessity, and convenience and the general welfare of the City of Kingsville and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KINGSVILLE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Kingsville, Texas, is amended by changing the zoning of Hoffman Addition, Block 7, Lot 20-21, also known as 200 Block E. Miller, Kingsville, Texas, from C4-Commercial District to R1-Single Family Residential District, as more specifically described on the Zone Change Map, attached as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. That the official Zoning Map of the City of Kingsville, Texas, is amended to reflect the amendments to the Zoning Ordinance made by Section 1 of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. That the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map of the City of Kingsville, Texas, as amended from time to time, except as changed by this ordinance and any other ordinances adopted on this date, remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 4. That to the extent that these amendments to the Zoning Ordinance represent a deviation from the Comprehensive Plan, the Comprehensive Plan is amended to conform to the Zoning Ordinance, as amended by this ordinance.

SECTION 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 6. That publication shall be made in the official publication of the City of Kingsville as required by the City Charter of the City of Kingsville.




Interim Speed Limit Proposed on Newly Constructed Southbound

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is responsible for the construction, maintenance, and traffic control on the roadway in question; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Kingsville had serious concerns about the previously proposed construction zone speed limit on the US 77 By-Pass frontage road from an area south of General Cavazos Blvd. to the southern city limits, which was previously proposed for 55 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, numerous citizens who live in that area have spoken during public comments at city commission meetings and signed a petition requesting the speed limit on the frontage road from General Cavazos Blvd. to the southern city limits be at a limit of no greater than 45 miles per hour due to concerns about safe ingress and egress from that roadway and their properties; and

WHEREAS, the roadway in question is owned by TxDOT who advises the plan to switch southbound traffic to the frontage road is close to occurring as they are nearing completion of construction of the frontage road and they conducted a traffic/speed study the week of May 16, 2022 on the new roadway; and

Summary: The City of Kingsville Tourism Department staffs and coordinates maintenance of the 1904 Historic Train Depot. Tourism staff has identified a need to refresh the paint at the Train Depot and has been working to identify a revenue source for the maintenance of the building.

Background: In assessing needs to beautify downtown and the 1904 Historic Train Depot, Tourism believes that the building needs power washing and painting. Purchasing Manager Charlie Sosa has budgeted some improvements that are ongoing, however, due to lack of funds, power washing and painting of the building had not yet been budgeted.

The City of Kingsville City Commission authorized ARPA funding in the amount of \$173,544 in HOT revenue related losses on January 24, 2022. The remaining balance in ARPA funds after commission-approved expenses is \$140,544.

Tourism Staff has worked with our Purchasing Manager to request quotes for power washing and painting and we received the attached quotes for the job. The lowest bid for the work is \$12,900 with Benito Martinez.

Financial Impact: The lowest bid to power wash and paint the building in \$12,900.

Recommendation: Staff recommends Commission approve the use of \$12,900 of ARPA funds for the power washing and painting of the Train Depot.



SUBJECT: **Update**Body-Worn Camera Grant Program, FY2022

Summary:

The Kingsville Police Department requested a resolution to apply for funds from the FY2022 Body-Worn Camera Grant Program. We were awarded the grant to purchase hardware and software to allow for the downloading of camera footage as well as software and hardware to allow for the storage of video from those cameras.

Background:

Funds may be used for obtaining body-worn cameras, digital video storage, and retrieval systems or cloud-based services. PSO will not pay for any service or subscription-based support that exceeds the cost prorated to the one-year project period.

Eligible officers. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.652, Occupations Code, grant funds may only be used to equip peace officers (as defined by Article 2.12, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure) who: 1) Engage in traffic or highway patrol or otherwise regularly detain or stop motor vehicles; or 2) Primary responders who respond directly to calls for assistance from the public.

Training. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.656, Occupations Code, a law enforcement agency must provide training to: 1) Peace officers who will wear the body worn cameras. 2) Any other personnel who will come into contact with video and audio data obtained from the use of body worn cameras.

Financial Impact:

We have been awarded a grant from BJA FY 20 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies. 54 FOCUS X1 BODY WORN CAMERA PACKAGE that includes:

Grand Total for 54 Coban Focus X1 Body Worn Camera Package \$41,310.00.

Funds must be used to purchase body-worn cameras and require a 1:1 match by the grantee, so BJA and the City of Kingsville are funding \$20,655.00 a piece for the cameras. Federal funds shall not be used to pay for data storage costs associated with body-worn camera footage.

As noted, the above-mentioned grant did not cover any costs for downloading of body camera's nor did it cover any storage for the camera footage. Therefore, we will be applying for hardware and software to allow for the downloading of camera footage as well has software and hardware to allow for the storage of video from those cameras.

SUBJECT:

Parks Parking Lot Funding

Summary:

There is a request to provide \$150,000 in funding for the Dick Kleber Park baseball/softball field parking lots in the Park system. There are several options available with certain restrictions attached.

General Fund:

During the budget adoption, \$300,000 is added to the calculation of fund balance for budget amendments during the fiscal year. To date, revenue budget amendments have been \$43,200 and expenditure budget amendments have been \$147,487.54 for a net budget amendment of \$104,287.54 which leaves \$195,712.46 available for General Fund budget amendments for the remainder of the year. Using \$150,000 from the General Fund would only allow \$45,712.46 for the remainder of this fiscal year. (Please note: We are expecting some budget amendments from staff due to equipment repairs and overtime caused by staffing and equipment shortages, as well as one for increased costs of motor fuel and oil.)

ARP Funds:

Below is the funding status of the ARP Funds. There is ARP funding available to cover the \$150,00, but it would only leave \$70,000 available for any other project commitments.
