The invocation was delivered by Ms. Courtney Alvarez, City Attorney, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge.

#### MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING(S)

#### Regular Meeting – June 9, 2025

Motion made by Commissioner Lopez to approve the minutes of June 9, 2025 as presented, seconded by Commissioner Alvarez. The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Lopez, Alvarez, Hinojosa, Alarcon, Fugate voting "FOR".

#### II. Public Hearing - (Required by Law).1

1. Public hearing on request for a Special Use Permit for an Auto Paint & Body Use (Vehicle Window Tinting Store) on a parcel of land in C2 (Retail) District at Orig Town,

## Block 58, Lot E. 118.5' of 1-4, E. 60' of 5,6 also known as 201 S. 6th St., Kingsville, TX 78363 (Property ID 11207) (Director of Planning and Development Services).

Mayor Fugate read and opened this public hearing at 5:02 p.m. Mayor Fugate further announced that this is a public hearing. If anyone would like to speak on behalf of this item they may do so now with a five-minute limit. Additional time cannot be extended by the City Commission.

Mr. Erik Spitzer, Director of Planning and Development Services stated that Mr. Jose Alberto Lopez, Applicant; Herman H. Ohlenbusch, Owner, approached the Planning Department on April 23rd, 2025, requesting approval of a Special Use Permit for an Auto Paint & Body Shop on a parcel of land in C2 (Retail District) at 201 S. 6th St., Kingsville, TX 78363 to tint windows on vehicles. In accordance with the City of Kingsville's Land Use Chart, an "Auto Paint & Body Shop" within land zoned as "C2 - Retail District" is permitted, provided a Special Use Permit is applied for and approved. The Planning and Zoning Commission meeting was held on June 18th, 2025, with 5 of 7 members in attendance. Members deliberated over the request to recommend approval of a Special Use Permit for an Auto Paint & Body Shop Use (Vehicle Window Tinting Store) on a parcel of land in C2 (Retail) District at 201 S. 6th St., Kingsville, TX 78363 (Property ID 11207). 7 Notice Letters were sent out to neighbors within the 200-foot buffer, and the city has received no feedback as of today. The Planning and Zoning Commission board members voted to approve the recommendation of a Special Use Permit for an "Auto Paint & Body Shop" at 201 S. 6th St., Kingsville, TX 78363. A recorded vote of all members present was taken, and board members Steve Zamora, Larry Garcia, Rev. Idotha Battle, Debbie Tiffee, Mike Klepac, Brian Coufal, and Krystal Emery all voted "YES."

There being no further discussion, Mayor Fugate closed this public hearing at 5:06 p.m.

Mr. Charlie Sosa, Interim City Manager, gave a brief report on street projects. He further announced events that will be taking place over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday. Mr. Sosa also reported that the Health Department will be spraying for mosquitoes the next few nights.

Ms. Courtney Alvarez, City Attorney, reported that the next city commission meeting is scheduled for Monday, July 14, 2025. The deadline for staff to submit agenda items for this meeting is Wednesday, July 2, 2025.

Commissioner Lopez commented that she had not seen the flags out in the downtown area and further asked Interim City Manager if the flags would be out for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

Mr. Sosa responded yes, flags will be placed in the downtown area for the upcoming holiday.

#### IV. Public Comment on Agenda Items.3

1. Comments on all agenda and non-agenda items.

Krystal Emery, 1620 S. 11<sup>th</sup> Street, commented that the recall petition against three commissioners was submitted, verified, and certified according to the city charter. These weren't Facebook fodder; this is a serious legal action taken by registered voters who believe accountability matters. I would hope that commissioners who are recalled choose to resign out of respect for the process and the people they have elected to serve. This has gotten personal, I felt it, and while I won't go into detail, I'll say this: no one should be targeted for participating in a legitimate democratic process. We are all citizens of Kingsville, and when the public speaks to the process laid out in the charter, that voice must be respected. Leadership means doing what's right for the community, showing up, owning your decisions, and respecting the process.

Joel Saenz, 307 W. Ailsie, commented that he is here for the recall issue and asked that if it comes for a vote, he asked for the vote to be no. Do to the fact that the four allegations that were printed in the newspaper indicated four items, and three of those items actually pick on staff doesn't reflect on the city commission's actions. Some of the staff, on TV it comes out that they are not educated and he would go back and ask HR to do their homework. Background checks as to how many people have actually worked for municipal government entity or the state of Texas prior to working for Kingsville. He again ask that the vote be no to the frivolous accusations.

Lance Hamm, 312 South Creek, commented the following: Point of Order for Agenda Item #20 (Discussion and presentation regarding the certification of recall petitions received on June 6, 2025), to Recall 3 City Commissioners. Lance Hamm, 912 South Creek. As a concerned tax-payer and qualified voter in the city of Kingsville, I have a POINT OF ORDER regarding Agenda Item 20, 1, I believe city officials have the wrong number for the number of qualified voters required to sign the petition for a recall of city commissioners as outlined in the City Charter and Agenda Item 20, making his petition for recall invalid. The number of valid signatures should be 2,805, not 282. 282 is a ridiculously low number of voters to initiate a recall that may cost the city upwards of \$70,000 for a couple of city elections, especially considering the average number of votes these three commissioners received during their winning election in May2024 was 852 votes. 2. I respectfully request that the Mayor and/or any Commissioner immediately make this point of order when Agenda Item #20 is read out loud. 3. The Mayor and all Commissioners should recu from ruling on this point of order due to bias and a conflict of interest, and an outside counsel (not a city employee) should make a ruling on this point of order. 4. The Mayor and/or any Commissioner should request that Agenda Item 20 be tabled until the outside counsel makes a ruling on this point of order. 5. If the mayor makes a ruling regarding this point of order tonight, I respectfully request that any or all Commissioners object to his ruling and issue an immediate appeal to the mayor's ruling, in which case the mayor and commissioners, per Robert's Rules of Order, will have to vote on the validity of the mayor's ruling. If the mayor's ruling is voted down, then I suggest the Mayor and all Commissioners take the matter to outside counsel for a proper ruling (without bias or conflict-of-interest). 6. The Mayor and/or any Commissioner should make the argument for this Point of Order regarding this agenda item due to the Kingsville City Charter (Part I, Article II, Section 24 Recall) that states that the petition relating to a recall of city commissioners, "shall be signed by qualified voters of the City equal in number to at least twenty percent (20%) of the number of qualified voters voting in the most recent city election." Using that language in context, if the city manager asked the city election officer the day before the May2024 election, "how many qualified voters are voting in tomorrow's election?", the answer would have been 14,025. Twenty percent of 14,025 is 2,805, and 2,805 signatures are required

to be on a petition to recall a Kingsville city commissioner, not 282. The main issue of contention is the word "voting" which implies an "event in progress" (the city charter does not use the word "voted," which would be an event that has happened in the past). So, the number of qualified voters in the "event in progress" for the election in May2024 was 14,025, and twenty percent of that number is 2,805. 7. In conclusion for this POINT OF ORDER, the number of "qualified voters voting" in the May2024 election was 14,025. For this recall petition to be valid, there must be a minimum of 20% of that number. Therefore, per the Kingsville City Charter, 2,805 valid signatures are required on the petition, not 282. Please, if you like, call me up for clarification during the discussion of this POINT OF ORDER for Agenda Item 20. Thank you for your consideration.

## 5. <u>Discuss and consider accepting the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report</u> (ACFR) of the City of Kingsville for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. (Finance Director).

Mayor Fugate asked if there were no objections, he would like to take agenda item #20 before item #5. No objections were made.

Mrs. Margaret Kelly, Auditor with Womack & Co., reported on the city's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. There were no findings or questioned costs in the current year. The city is tracking along well in all accounts. There were some recommendations made with regard to written controls.

Motion made by Commissioner Lopez to approve and accept the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) of the City of Kingsville for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, seconded by Commissioner Alvarez. The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Hinojosa, Alarcon, Lopez, Alvarez, Fugate voting "FOR".

6. Discuss and consider introduction of an ordinance amending the zoning ordinance by granting a Special Use Permit for an Auto Paint & Body Shop Use (Vehicle Window Tinting Store) in in C2 (Retail) District at 201 S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Kingsville, Texas, also known as Original Town, Block 58, Lot E. 118.5' of 1-4, E. 60' of 5,6, (Property ID 11207); amending the comprehensive plan to account for any deviations from the existing comprehensive plan. (P&Z June 18, 2025) (Director of Planning and Development Services).

## 7. <u>Discussion with City's Representative on the Kleberg County Appraisal District Board of Directors. (Commissioner Lopez).</u>

Ms. Ernestina Flores, Chief Appraiser for the Kleberg County Appraisal District, gave a presentation to the city commission regarding how appraisal values are determined.

## 8. Workshop: Discussion on proposed Employee Health Insurance Benefits, City Fund Balance, and related items. (Human Resources Director/Finance Director/Interim City Manager).

Mrs. Diana Gonzales, Human Resources Director, stated that the City of Kingsville (City) distributed RFP 25-16 on April 17, 2025, and opened bids on May 20, 2025, at 2 p.m. The city received responses to RFP 25-16 from BlueCross BlueShield and United Healthcare. As has been indicated during past City Commission meetings, the City has been able to absorb rate increases (12% in 2023 and 14% in 2024) for the past two years utilizing the Health Fund balance. This option was available to assist employees during the transition from a self-funded health plan to a fully funded health plan. Carlisle Insurance (Acrisure) representative Ms. Valeria Ybarra, a Registered Employee Benefit Consultant (REBC), assisted the City with the RFP process and evaluation of submitted bids.

Ms. Valeria Ybarra, Employee Benefits Consultant with Acrisure, spoke about the different options the city could consider, as well as the options available to the employee. Ms. Ybarra stated that the new benefits would be effective October 1, 2025, with open enrollment in August 2025. RFPs were posted on April 14, 2025, and were due by May 20, 2025. There were two responses: United Healthcare and BlueCross BlueShield of Texas. United Healthcare proposed a renewal increase of +15%. There are three different options and plans for the employees. Plan 1, HMO Plan, the recommended replacement plan is as follows: \$3,000 deductible, 100% coinsurance; reduced out-of-pocket max; reduced increase from 15% to 2.42%; reduced urgent care copay; pharmacy stays the same; and same network as current. Plan 2, EPO Plan, the recommended replacement plan is as follows: \$1,500 deductible, 80% coinsurance, reduces increase from 15% to 2.94%, slight increase to primary care physician visit copay, same urgent care copay, pharmacy stays

the same, same network as current. Plan 3, PPO Plan, the recommended replacement plan is \$750 deductible, 80% coinsurance, reduces increase from 15% to 4.99%, slight increase to primary care physician visit copay, same urgent care copay, pharmacy stays the same, and same network as current.

Mrs. Gonzales stated that the HMO Plan is a gated plan, but it also offers a much larger network. She further stated that even though the EPO and PPO Plans are not gated, trying to make an appointment with a specialist, you would usually have to go to your PCP as a specialist will not take a direct walk-in at a specialist office. Mrs. Gonzales further stated that for background information, Fiscal Year 2024-2025 is the third year of the United Healthcare fully funded plan. The City of Kingsville offers three (3) health plan options which employees may select. Based on the RFP tabulations of 260 employees on the insurance census report at the time the city distributed the RFP, the tabulated costs are as follows: United Health Care plan cost is \$5,196,761.00, and BlueCross BlueShield is \$5,542,913.00. These costs are approximate as the type of coverage for vacant positions can only be estimated. In addition, employees can change coverage at open enrollment and with qualifying events during the fiscal year. Furthermore, the City experiences some vacancies throughout the year, which will also impact insurance costs. By utilizing some of the remaining Health Fund balance, this allows for the possibility of the Health Fund balance assisting with a portion of premiums in FY26-27. Annual cost breakdown estimate, if all positions filled for the entire Fiscal Year 25-26 would be as follows: Employer Contributions of \$4,585,347.00; Health Fund Contribution of \$507,600.00; and Employee Contributions of \$863,353.00.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked if the 15% would be an increase across the board. Mrs. Gonzales responded that we made no changes to the plan; it would be a 15% increase, which equals \$800,000.00. Commissioner Hinojosa further asked if there would be some costs that would be passed down to the employees. Mrs. Gonzales, yes. Commissioner Hinojosa stated that maybe the city could use the fund balance from the self-insured. Mrs. Gonzales stated that this would be utilizing approximately \$500,000 of the fund balance to already offset that.

Mr. Sosa stated that the fund balance is an accounting term that represents the difference between a fund's assets and liabilities. It represents the net cash after all revenues have been deposited, and all expenses have been paid. For the City of Kingsville, there are two funds with a required minimum 25% fund balance. These are General Fund 001 and Utility Fund 051. During the budget process, you will hear budget terms of EA, which is Estimated Actuals, and DR for Departmental Request. EA Revenues represent the estimated amount that the city will collect or receive in the current fiscal year. EA expenditures represent the estimated amount the city will spend in the current fiscal year. DR Revenues represent the anticipated amount of revenues the city will collect or receive in the next fiscal year, and DR Expenditures represent the anticipated amount of revenues the city will spend in the next fiscal year. Mr. Sosa further stated that working on the budget this early in the fiscal year is challenging, requiring conservative estimating. The ending estimated fund balances for the current fiscal year determine what is available for the next fiscal year. During the budget process, estimates are determined for both revenues and expenditures. For expenditures, all line items are calculated to determine what will be spent in the current year for that item. All current year expenditure budget amounts above the calculated amounts are removed and placed in the department year-end reduction line item, as it represents the amount that is budgeted but not expected to be needed for that line item. The amount placed in the year-end reduction line item is not included in the estimated ending fund balance, as these amounts are expected to drop to the fund balance and available for next year's budget availability. Throughout June and August, adjustments are made to the year-end reduction line items. These adjustments come from the Department Directors through budget transfer requests. Once the City Manager and/or Finance reviews

and approves the request, funds are moved back to the department's budget if necessary. Fund balance estimates are monitored to ensure the 25% required minimum is met. During this time, it may become necessary to adjust priorities due to spending availability. General funds, amounts removed and placed in the year-end reduction line items is \$888,281.08. Due to the status of the Utility Fund, \$1 million of the transfer scheduled from the Utility Fund was cancelled. The general fund took steps in the current fiscal year to freeze 13 positions for the entire fiscal year. Using the estimates, expenditure can only increase by \$850,000 to end the year with 25%, with the revenues coming in. There would also be less funding available for supplements to be approved. The fund balances are as follows: audited beginning fund balance is \$7,939,595.69; EA Revenues are \$24,760,815.41; EA Expenditures is \$25,310,684.35; and EA Fund Balance is \$7,389,726.75.

Commissioner Alvarez asked for an explanation regarding the status of the Utility Fund. Due to the status of the Utility Fund, \$1 million of the transfer scheduled from the Utility Fund was cancelled. Was the Utility Fund part of the general fund?

Mr. Sosa responded that \$1 million was being transferred from the utility fund to the general fund, which was normal practice in the past. But now being a shortfall for the utility fund that transfer will be cancelled because we cannot afford to transfer the \$1 million.

Mrs. Balli stated that on that transfer, currently in this fiscal year it was budgeted \$1.6 million for the transfer to go from the utility fund to the general fund which will cover expenditures and different things that the general fund does for the utility fund. Balli further stated that based on where the numbers come out, the ending for this fiscal year, the city will not be meeting its 25% fund balance requirement.

Commissioner Alvarez asked if the city would fall short. Mrs. Balli's response was yes.

Mrs. Balli stated that when the EA's were reviewed and based on our spending for the current year that we are in, we moved and placed into the year and reduction line item \$1.3 million. Due to the status of the utility fund, \$1 million of the transfer scheduled for general fund was cancelled; it was sent back to utility fund. One of the reasons for the shortfall is that we are not meeting the revenue productions that were estimated for this current year. The estimated fund balance for last fiscal year ended short by \$1.4 million and for what we anticipated and this was basically due to the depreciation that we have to book. She further stated that utility funds have always had enough coverage so that when we made that depreciation booking, there was enough fund balance to cover that depreciation. Last year's depreciation was \$1,068,000.00, with the fiscal year 23-24 ending at 24.97%. which was the minimum 25%. She stated that if we include another million for this year's depreciation, if that was to be booked now, and budget in the EA's fund balance would drop to 16.86%, which we can't do. She stated that when you use the estimates below, the beginning fund balance in utility with \$3.1 million. The EA revenues that we have, included in the proposed budget, are \$10.891,419.14 with the EA expenditures at \$10,999,228.75, that's with \$1.3 million pulled out. If we keep those estimates, we will end up with a fund balance of \$3,023,472.82, which is 27.49%. Balli stated that in order for it to go to 25%, we only have a cushion of \$210,000 that can be removed from the department year-end budget. If the departments have to pull more than \$210,000 out of year-end reduction line item, we will not hit our 25% and we could not do the million dollars for depreciation which gets booked in March, when the auditors are here.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked that if the figures that are shown for the general and utility fund are estimates and not actuals and are not budgeted. Mrs. Balli responded that they are not actuals and not budgeted but they are part of the budget but we know that we are not making our productions and our utility fund, fund balance, ended less than what was anticipated. Balli further stated that at this time it is being looked at as they do during budget

and we have this opportunity to figure out how to close that gap so that we can meet our fund balance. Right now, we would meet our fund balance at 27.49% as long as we do not pull more than \$210,000 out of the department's year-end reduction. Balli stated that today we had to pull out almost \$30,000 out of it, which brings it down to \$180,000.

Mayor Fugate asked that, with regards to the water meter system that we have installed, is it keeping up with projections.

Mrs. Balli responded that the problem with the projections that were done this year is that it was a two-prong effect. They got hit with accurate meter readings and then the city did increases on the rates. What we are seeing is that citizens are using less water, which causes our projections from being met.

Commissioner Hinojosa stated that you may have a certain estimate today, but that estimate might change tomorrow based on the facts and circumstances at that time.

Mrs. Balli stated that what the city does from this point forward until we get the budget adopted, almost every week staff will be looking at the EA's to see how they changed and whether projects need to be done differently. She further stated that this is one of those things where you try to use the trends that have been coming in or going out. The city has things that are contractual that can't be changed. This is something that staff needs to look at from not until September. Balli stated that staff knows that the city has to take measures now, to figure out how we are going to close that gap.

Mr. Sosa commented that with regards to the water meters, it did affect the city with the water usage and wastewater usage as they are both combined together. Not only did the city not see the revenues for the water usage from the water meters, but also for the wastewater. These are the two revenues that staff anticipated coming in but were not seen.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked if once the taxpayer found out that they would be paying for more water, that stopped using the water, which affected the utility. Mr. Sosa responded yes.

Mrs. Balli reported on the Tourism Fund. The Tourism Fund does not have any minimum fund balance requirements. The major change in Fiscal Year 24-25 for this fund was due to personnel changes. The audited beginning fund balance is \$591,896.04, with the EA Revenues projections are at \$691,354.42. The EA expenditures are \$598,920.73 with the EA Fund Balance for the current year is at \$684,329.73, which makes Tourism Fund in good shape. In the Economic Development fund, this does not have a minimum balance requirement. The general fund and in leu of tax revenues provides funding for economic development efforts. A major change in FY 24-25 for this fund was due to personnel changes in February. The Economic Development Director is not housed 100% under the city's direction and budget for this fund, will need to increase in Fiscal Year 25-26. The audited fund balance is \$268,702,736 with EA revenues at \$313,109.44 and EA expenditures at \$274,038.48. The EA fund balance is \$307,773.69. Balli stated that this fund is in good shape. Balli stated that in the general fund debt service, which is for all the general fund debt issues, the fund balance doesn't change very much due to money going in and paying for general fund debt issues, so it maintains a fund balance, it is being looked at ending this year with \$661,000.00. Balli briefly mentioned other city funds but did not go into detail. Balli stated that in the Insurance Fund, the city began with \$2.3 million, based on the revenues and expenditures that have been estimated, to end this year with \$1.1 million, of which \$500,000 will be used, if the plan is accepted. Balli stated that for a total of all funds, there is \$26,338,000.00 estimated to end this fiscal year with.

Mr. Sosa stated that upcoming workshops are as follows: July 14<sup>th</sup> will discuss TMRS plan changes, compensation plan changes, updated fund balance updates, Tourism Fund 002, and Economic Development Fund 098. On July 28<sup>th</sup>, the discussion will be on Utility Fund 051, Utility Rate Increases, Enterprise Fleet Contract, and Utility Rate Increases. On August 11<sup>th</sup>, General Fund 001, Rates & Fee Increases, Ad Valorem Tax Rates, and Fund Balance Updates. August 12<sup>th</sup>, Budget Summary, Updated Fund Balances, Transfers, Debt Service, and Grant Projects Status. He further stated that if the commission would like any additional information addressed at one of the upcoming workshops, please contact staff so it may be added to the schedule.

## 9. <u>Consideration and approval of awarding Bid #25-16 Group Medical Employee</u> Benefits Program for City employees, as per the recommendation of the consultant. (Human Resources Director).

Mrs. Gonzalez stated that it is recommended to support the consultants' recommendation of the three options with United Health Care.

Motion made by Commissioner Alvarez to award Bid #25-16 Group Medical Employee Benefits Program for city employees, as per the recommendation of the consultant.

Motion made by Commissioner Alvarez to approve awarding Bid #25-16 Group Medical Employee Benefits Program for City employees, as per the recommendation of the consultant, seconded by Commissioner Alarcon. The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Alarcon, Lopez, Alvarez, Hinojosa, Fugate voting "FOR".

## 10. Consideration and approval of a resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the Ed Rachal Foundation for grant funds for equipment for the Kingsville Police Department. (Police Chief).

Mr. John Blair, Chief of Police, stated that critical personal protective equipment of the tactical team will be purchased with this funding. This grant does not have a cash match; however, it is understood from previous applications and awards that, on occasion, they may only approve partial funding of the grant.

Motion made by Commissioner Lopez to approve the resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the Ed Rachal Foundation for grant funds for equipment for the Kingsville Police Department, seconded by Commissioner Alvarez. The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Lopez, Alvarez, Hinojosa, Alarcon, Fugate voting "FOR".

## 11. Consideration and approval of a resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the Gary Sinise Foundation for grant funds for equipment for the Kingsville Police Department. (Police Chief).

Chief Blair stated that critical personal protective equipment for the tactical team will be purchased with this funding. The current equipment is expired and is outdated technology. These funds will purchase the Hard Head Veterans ATE Lite Helmet with helmet covers and Pop Out Rail Adapter Kit. This grant does not have a cash match; however, it is understood from previous applications and awards from other Foundation Grants, on occasion they may only approve partial funding of the grant.

Motion made by Commissioner Alarcon to approve the resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the Gary Sinise Foundation for grant funds for equipment for the Kingsville Police Department, seconded by Commissioner Lopez.

The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Alvarez, Hinojosa, Alarcon, López, Fugate voting "FOR".

## 12. <u>Consideration and approval of a resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the 1PointFive First Responder Donation Program for grant funds for First Responder equipment, gear, and training for the Kingsville Police Department. (Police Chief).</u>

Chief Blair stated that this resolution is to apply to 1PointFive to be considered for their First Responder Donation Program. This funding can be used for: purchase of essential emergency response equipment; repair of existing emergency response equipment; replacement of outdated or damaged rescue and safety gear; and first responder safety training programs.

Motion made by Commissioner Lopez to approve the resolution authorizing the City to submit an application to the 1PointFive First Responder Donation Program for grant funds for First Responder equipment, gear, and training for the Kingsville Police Department, seconded by Commissioner Hinojosa. The motion was passed and approved by the following vote: Hinojosa, Alarcon, Lopez, Alvarez, Fugate voting "FOR".

## 13. <u>Discuss and consider introduction of an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget to appropriate additional funding for Fire Department vehicle maintenance.</u> (Fire Chief).

Mr. Juan J. Adame, Fire Chief, stated that the Kingsville Fire Department has received past due invoices in the amount of \$19,145.67. additionally, the department has experienced numerous equipment problems this budget year. The latest mechanical issues have resulted in a repair cost totaling \$25,892.00. These problems included electrical, air conditioning, and hydraulic repairs. This year the Fire Department budgeted \$35,000 for vehicle maintenance. Additional funding is requested to cover the cost of the past due invoices. A budget amendment is being requested to cover the necessary vehicle repairs.

Commissioner Lopez asked if the department was down to only one ambulance. Chief Adame responded that all three ambulances are running.

## 20. <u>Discussion and presentation regarding the certification of recall petitions received on June 6, 2025. (City Secretary).</u>

Mrs. Mary Valenzuela, City Secretary, stated that on June 6, 2025, the Office of City Secretary received recall petitions seeking the removal of City Commissioners Alvarez, Alarcon, and Hinojosa from the office of City Commissioner. After receiving the petitions, the signatures were reviewed for certification. Of the 330 signatures submitted, a total of 292 signatures were certified, and 38 signatures were not. The City of Kingsville Charter Article II, Section 24 (4) provides that petitions shall be signed by qualified voters of the City equal in number to at least twenty percent (20%) of the number of qualified voters voting in the most recent city election. The last City Election was held on May 4, 2024. A total of 1,412 votes were cast in that election as reflected in Resolution #2024-94 that was approved by the City Commission on May 13, 2024. Twenty percent of 1,412 votes is 282.4, which is the number of certified signatures needed to initiate a recall election. The City of Kingsville Charter Article II, Section 24 (6) states "If the officer whose removal is sought does not resign within five (5) calendar days after such notice is given then it shall become the duty of the City Commission to order an election and fix a date for holding such recall election. If you either choose not to resign or you do not notify me of your intent to resign by June 28, 2025, then an agenda item to order a recall election and fix a date for holding such an election will be presented to the City Commission at the next City Commission Meeting.

#### I. Preliminary Proceedings.

#### **OPEN MEETING**

Mayor Fugate opened the meeting at 5:00 p.m. with all five commission members present.

#### **INVOCATION / PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – (Mayor Fugate)**

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Courtney Alvarez, City Attorney, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge.

#### MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING(S)

None.

- II. Public Hearing (Required by Law).1

#### III. Reports from Commission & Staff.<sup>2</sup>

"At this time, the City Commission and Staff will report/update on all committee assignments which may include but is not limited to the following: Planning & Zoning Commission, Zoning Board of Adjustments, Historical Board, Housing Authority Board, Library Board, Health Board, Tourism, Chamber of Commerce, Coastal Bend Council of Governments, Conner Museum, Keep Kingsville Beautiful, and Texas Municipal League. Staff reports include the following: Building & Development, Code Enforcement, Proposed Development Report; Accounting & Finance – Financial Services - Information, Investment Report, Quarterly Budget Report, Monthly Financial Reports; Police & Fire Department – Grant Update, Police & Fire Reports; Street Updates; Public Works-Building Maintenance, Construction Updates; Park Services - grant(s) update, miscellaneous park projects, Administration –Workshop Schedule, Interlocal Agreements, Public Information, Hotel Occupancy Report, Quiet Zone, Proclamations, Health Plan Update, Tax Increment Zone Presentation, Main Street Downtown, Chapter 59 project, Financial Advisor, Water And Wastewater Rate Study Presentation. No formal action can be taken on these items at this time."

Mr. Charlie Sosa, Interim City Manager, briefly reported on street projects.

Ms. Courtney Alvarez, City Attorney, reported that the next meeting is scheduled for July 28, 2025, with agenda items for that meeting due today, July 16, 2025. She further stated that she had been asked a question, which a memo has been provided to the commission, whether the city is required to provide any notice regarding the next steps with regard to the item that was not approved on July 14<sup>th</sup>. She further stated that there is no specific language in the Charter, Article II, Section 24 (6)(7) or any other parts that require that any additional notices be presented to anyone. She continued to state that if someone were to ask, staff would answer the question, but no additional notices are required.

Mayor Fugate stated that what Ms. Alvarez is saying is that if someone, a citizen, can take an order for Judge Pulcher to sign, and there is no service or notices that are required.

Ms. Alvarez responded no. All this is saying is that the Charter doesn't require the city or the city secretary to give notice to a circulator with regard to the recall petition of what the next step is, now that the ordinance wasn't approved.

Mayor Fugate asked who takes the next step? Does the city take the next step, or does a private citizen take the next step?

Ms. Alvarez responded that the Charter doesn't require that the city take the next step.

Mayor Fugate asked if the city is out of it?

Ms. Alvarez responded that until we get served with something, the city is out of it.

Mayor Fugate asked Ms. Alvarez where in the Charter does it say that the city is required to be served with anything.

Ms. Alvarez responded that, as she didn't bring that section of the Charter with her, it doesn't say that we would have to be served with something, but it says if the commission or the city secretary or somebody else doesn't do their obligations as they are laid out in that section of the Charter, then a citizen could initiate action.

Mayor Fugate asked if this was in the Charter?

Ms. Alvarez responded yes. She stated that she believes it is Article II, Section 24(7).

Mayor Fugate asked if the city was completely out of this now.

Ms. Avarez responded yes.

Commissioner Hinojosa commented that he was the one who posed this question, as he does not know what the next step is. He stated that he and Ms. Alvarez had a discussion and it cannot go to the District Court, according to the summary opinion letter from Liza Wood, where it says the fact findings and all that, it states that we could not assign those legal duties to the District Court so then it goes to the Thirteenth Court of Appeals through a mandamus. Hinojosa asked if this was correct. He further stated that under the Texas Election Code, it states that a Writ of Mandamus can be sought in the Thirteenth Court of Appeals. Commissioner Hinojosa stated that with this being said, this was his question, as this is what is stated in the opinion that was provided by Mrs. Wood in her summary of opinion.

Mayor Fugate asked if everyone received a copy of this opinion. Ms. Alvarez responded yes. Mayor Fugate further asked where this opinion was at. Ms. Alvarez responded that it was emailed.

Commissioner Alvarez asked what Commissioner Hinojosa was displaying.

Commissioner Hinojosa stated that he had received a Summary of Opinion Letter.

Commissioner Alvarez commented that she had not received the document Commissioner Hinojosa is referring to, Summary of Opinion Letter. Commissioner Alvarez further asked if Commissioner Hinojosa received only four pages of the opinion and further asked to see exactly what Commissioner Hinojosa was speaking about. Alvarez stated that she had received only four pages of the opinion, but Commissioner Hinojosa has a one-page summary.

Ms. Alvarez stated that she does not know, and maybe Al could have done that, but she has not seen the document. She further stated that there was a four-page document that was emailed.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked if Ms. Alvarez had not received the additional page.

Ms. Alvarez responded that she has not seen what Commissioner Hinojosa is looking at.

Commissioner Hinojosa commented that the summary was attached to his email, and the document states that it has to go to the Court of Appeals. He further stated that this is why he wanted someone, so that when they come to the City Secretary, what are we supposed to tell them? Are we to notify the third party which is his concern. He further stated that according to Ms. Alvarez, the city does not have to say anything.

Ms. Alvarez responded that if someone asks, we will answer their question, but the Charter doesn't obligate or state that you have to initiate anything. She further stated that there are other sections in the Charter with regards to the recall, where it says that the City Secretary has to immediately notify you once she gets the affidavits requesting petitions for recall. It has language like that when the city is obligated to do certain things, make certain notifications. There is no language like that after the ordinance does not pass.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked if the city has to wait until the third-party files some type of motion with the Thirteenth Court of Appeals.

Ms. Alvarez responded yes, and that's because the election code has language in it.

Mayor Fugate asked that after the Writ of Mandamus is filed with the Thirteenth Court, and all the notices go out, does the city engage it then? Does the city spend money on this?

Ms. Alvarez responded yes.

Commissioner Alvarez asked if we had to get attorneys, but doesn't the third party also have to get attorneys as well?

Ms. Alvarez responded yes.

Commissioner Alvarez asked if the third party sues the city, as that is what she has heard.

Ms. Alvarez responded that they would file a suit against the city or commission to order you to do what the Charter says to do.

Commissioner Alvarez commented that there was nothing in the Charter.

Ms. Alvarez stated that what she had said that with regards to the question that was posed to her earlier today, which is why she read what was asked, does the city have to initiate a notice letter to the circulator to advise them what the next step is now that the ordinance wasn't approved. She further stated that her comment was that the Charter does not require the city to take that action.

Commissioner Hinojosa asked that if anyone goes to the City Secretary, the City Secretary is to refer them to the City Attorney.

Ms. Alvarez responded that the City Secretary could do so.

Commissioner Lopez asked if the third party could come in and ask what the next step is.

Ms. Alvarez responded yes, but we can't give them legal advice, but we can tell them to seek an attorney.

Commissioner Hinojosa stated that his other question, which the mayor already touched on, is that the city is already going to spend the money, but staff will ask TML to see if this is something that could be covered. But if they don't, it would be paid for through the city's general fund.

Ms. Alvarez responded yes and stated that anytime the city is served with a legal notice for a type of suit, it goes to the city's carrier to determine if our coverage provides for that type of action. She further stated that it is very individual and specific, but if it isn't something within the realm of our coverage and if there is an exception, then this would be something for the city to spare the expense of.

Mayor Fugate asked if the writ is sustained, which should be very well sustained, then the city could be liable for the citizens' attorney fees.

Ms. Alvarez responded that it is possible that they could request relief from the city in the form of reimbursement of attorney fees.

Commissioner Alvarez asked Commissioner Hinojosa if she could see the summary, as she did not receive a copy.

Ms. Alvarez commented that it is a staff update.



### Miss Kingsville 1950 and the famous Pinto Bean Cookoff

(Editor's note: In this feature, we take readers back through our archives, lighting some of the people and events of the past century. Many issues are still in paper form, some are digitized, and a microfilm. The issues

from 1918 to July of 1924 were lost in a fire, however, the rest remain intact. Here is a look back at what was happening this week in Kingsville.)

#### 25 years ago


July 2000
The city announced that
20 candidates had applied
for the Chief of Police position in Kingsville. All but one of them were from Texas, one from Bishop

and five from Kingsville. Kingsville resident John C. Johnson of the Kingsville Benevolent and P tective Order of Elks #1926 was installed as the new leader of the South District of Texas State Elks Association during the 136th Annual National Grand Lodge Convention in Dallas. As the Elks national representative for this area, for working with local Elks

Lodges to fulfill the order's long-standing commitment to promote charity and patriotism in communities.

#### 50 years ago July 1975 The First Annual World

Pinto Bean Cookoff was over and the Kingsville Police Association was already talking about the next year's festivities. An estimated 10,000 people attended the three-day event at the new Kleberg County Park. The chief said an effort to get big name entertainment would be made for the following year. There were 22 entries in the pinto bean cookoff with Rudy Herrera of Rudy's Trim Shop taking first place. Higinio Gonzalez of Robstown took second place, Mayor Gilbert Acuna came in third and Mario Salazar took fourth. Miss

Vicky Luna, 17, of Alice was crowned queen and handed out the trophies. Spectators from as far away as London, England were there to witness first hand such events as the ialapeno eating contest. The Kingsville Police Associaestimated that it made \$2,000 on the festival.

Meanwhile, burglaries in Kingsville had almost doubled in a year. But the rate up slightly. The burglaries of homes were the same as the previous year, however, it was the burglaries of businesses that was on the rise. There had been 145 business burglaries in 1975 as compared to 73 the same

time the previous year.

The Columbian Ladies of Council 2623 had celebrated their 12th anniversary back in June with a dance at the K.C. Hall on 14th street. The Rev. John McGrath, pastor of St. Martins Catholic Church, installed new officers and awards were presented to 18 members who received charter membership certificates, Mrs. Arturo Ramirez was named outstanding member of the Columbian Ladies.

Kingsville Record re-porter, Gloria Bigger wrote a feature story on Miguel Muniz, a King Ranch Cowboy who was still practicing a trade that was al-most extinct. Muniz made horses' leads, hackamores, bridle reins, saddle girths and quirts. He made riding equipment with hair taken from a horse's mane or tail and had been doing it on a full-time basis since 1940. Muniz had lived on the King Ranch since 1917.





It has been determined that the structure at 525 E Ave D Kingsville, TX 78363 is in a significant state of disrepair and creates a safety and health hazard to the surrounding area and the community at large. The structure is in direct violation to the City of Kingsville's Code of Ordinance § 15-1-165 Condemned Building or Structure; Specifications as adopted and as stated below.

### § 15-1-165 CONDEMNED BUILDING OR STRUCTURE; SPECIFICATIONS.

- (A) Any building or structure of any type of material, whether public or private property, existing within the city limits, which is determined to be unsafe for or dangerous to human occupancy, shall be declared and be and become a condemned building or structure.
- (B) The condemned buildings or structures mentioned in division (A) shall be determined to be such under the following listed terms and conditions:
- (1) Any building or structure which, for want of repair or by reason of age or dilapidated condition, or for any causes, is especially liable to fire, and which is so situated as to endanger other buildings or property, or so occupied that fire would endanger persons or property therein.
- (2) Any building or other structure which shall be determined to have a permanent or temporary plumbing condition existing in violation of the installation, maintenance and repair provisions of the City Plumbing Code presently duly enacted or to be duly enacted from time to time, and which shall be further determined, by virtue of such condition in violation of the provisions of the Plumbing Code to endanger the safety of the building or structure or other buildings or structures or other property, and to endanger the safety and health of persons who may have occasion to occupy and/or be in, on or about the premises, whether they be the owner thereof or not.
- (3) Any building or other structure which shall be determined to have a permanent or temporary electrical installation condition existing in violation of the installation, maintenance or repair provisions of the City Electrical Code as it is presently duly enacted or may be enacted from time to time, and which shall be further determined, by virtue of such condition in violation of the provisions of the Electrical Code to endanger the safety of the building or structure or other buildings or structures or other property, and to endanger the safety and health of persons who may have occasion to occupy and/or be in, on or about the premises, whether they be the owner thereof or not.
- (4) Any building or structure which shall be determined to contain a faulty and defective structural condition existing in violation of the construction, maintenance and repair provisions of the City Building Code as is presently duly enacted or may be enacted from time to time, and which shall be further determined, by virtue of

such condition in violation of the Building Code to endanger the safety of the building or structure or other buildings or structures or other property, and to endanger the safety and health of persons who may have occasion to occupy and/or be in, on or about the premises, whether they be the owner thereof or not.

(5) Any building or structure which shall be determined to have a permanent or temporary sanitary condition existing in violation of the various health and sanitation ordinances duly enacted and to be enacted from time to time, and which shall be further determined, by virtue of such condition in violation of the provisions of the sanitation ordinances to endanger the safety of the building or structure or other buildings or structures or other property, and to endanger the safety and health of persons who may have occasion to occupy and/or be in, on or about the premises, whether they be the owner thereof or not.

('62 Code, § 4-6-1)

A person appointed to this position must meet guidelines established by Texas Local Government Code Chapter 143.006 (c) as follows:

- 1. be of good moral character,
- 2. be a United States citizen,
- 3. be a resident of the municipality who has resided in the municipality for more than three years,
- 4. be over 25 years of age, and
- 5. not have held a public office within the preceding three years.

#### Additional exceptions to (c)5 above,

"the municipality's chief executive may reappoint a commission member to consecutive terms. A commission member may not be reappointed to more than a third consecutive term unless the member's reappointment to a fourth or subsequent consecutive term is confirmed by a two-thirds majority of all the members of the municipality's governing body."

#### **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES STUDENTS**

THE STATE OF TEXAS

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

**COUNTIES OF NUECES** 

This agreement is between Texas EMS Academy operating under the laws of the State of Texas, and Kingsville Fire Department herein referred to as (KFD), an emergency medical service under the laws of the State of Texas.

WHEREAS, Texas EMS Academy, through its education department, provides state-approved courses to the public in Emergency Medical Technology as an Emergency Medical Responder, Emergency Medical Technician, and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician levels (collectively called EMS students); and

WHEREAS, Texas EMS Academy and KFD are authorized to enter into this agreement under the Interlocal Cooperation Act; and

#### IT IS THEREFORE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. KFD will accept EMS students for experience, training, and instruction in emergency medical practice and treatment in their Urgent Care and/Wellness Facilities. The number of EMS students attending any given facility shall be determined by the Clinical Coordinator or his/her delegated representative at his/her discretion.
- 2. KFD will provide medical personnel at each facility, who will directly supervise any care rendered, and any procedures performed by the EMS students. EMS students will be permitted hands-on training during their rotations at the sole discretion of the Medic-in-Command of the facility. KFD will instruct EMS students that they are under the strict and direct supervision of the medical staff and must strictly obey that agent's instructions at all times.
- 3. Texas EMS Academy will provide a staff EMS Clinical Coordinator to set up scheduling for EMS students and to assure adherence to KFD's policy. The Coordinator will provide supervision, rotation scheduling, and record keeping for all EMS students involved in internship rotations.

- 4. Texas EMS Academy will provide a one-week to one-month advanced notice of the dates on which the EMS students require rotation, including a roster of personnel and a suggested schedule with the times and dates of rotations.
- 5. Texas EMS Academy shall provide and maintain Student Blanket Liability Insurance with liability limits of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$3,000,000.00 in aggregate and will keep such coverage during the life of this agreement. Proof of Insurance shall be submitted to KFD upon request. KFD shall receive thirty (30) days written notification of any proposed changes/cancellations of said insurance. Texas EMS Academy warrants that all EMS students scheduled will have successfully completed all required didactic and skills course work required by the Texas Department of State Health Services and shall have met all skill competencies and assessments required to begin EMS Internship at the prospective levels of training.
- 6. As consideration for allowing EMS students to receive a hands-on training by KFD, and prior to his/her first rotation, each EMS student will sign a release/waiver agreeing to indemnify and forever hold harmless KFD, its officers, agents, and employees, for any and all lawsuits, claims, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses (including court costs, attorney's fees, and expert witness fees) from, for, or on account of any injury to any person or death at any time resulting from such injury, damages to any property which may arise or which may be alleged to have arisen out of or in connection with any activity by an EMS student pursuant to this agreement. It is agreed by and the intention of the EMS students to indemnify KFD regardless of whether the claims, demands, or suits rise from the sole or joint negligence of the party indemnified herein. KFD and Texas EMS Academy agree that all EMS students shall execute the release/waiver, and that no EMS student may participate until and unless such release/waiver is executed and delivered to the Clinical Coordinator of Texas EMS Academy.
- 7. As to all activities connected with this agreement, neither Texas EMS Academy nor KFD shall be responsible to the other for personal injuries caused by the acts or omissions, if any, of either party or their contractors. Stated otherwise, neither party agrees to indemnify or hold harmless the other party as to personal injuries arising out of this agreement. The liability, if any, of either party shall be that prescribed by the laws of the State of Texas.
- 8. This agreement shall be effective on July 16, 2025, or on such date as it becomes active by signature of all officials of the parties to the agreement and shall be for an indefinite period. It shall be subject to review and renewal by either party through written notice by both parties. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time upon sixty (60) days' notice to the other party.

9. This Agreement is entered into under the authority of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Government Code. The EMS students of Texas EMS Academy under the Agreement are not employees of KFD and no employer/employee or master/servant relationship is established by this agreement.



# Miss Kingsville 1950 and the famous Pinto Bean Cookoff

(Editor's this feature, we take readers back through our archives, highlighting some of the people and of the past century. Many issues are still in paper form, some are digitized, and a few are on microfilm. The issues

from 1918 to July of 1924 were lost in a fire, however, the rest remain intact. Here is a look back at what was happening this week in Kingsville.)

#### 25 years ago July 2000

The city announced that 20 candidates had applied for the Chief of Police po-sition in Kingsville. All but one of them were from Texas, one from Bishop and five from Kingsville.



Johnson of the Kingsville Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks #1926 was installed as the new leader of the South District of Texas State Elks Association during the 136th Annual National Grand Lodge Convention in Dallas. As the Elks national representative for this area. Johnson was responsible for working with local Elks

Lodges to fulfill the order's

long-standing commitment to promote charity and patriotism in communities.

## 50 years ago July 1975

The First Annual World Pinto Bean Cookoff was over and the Kingsville Police Association already talking about the next year's festivities. An estimated 10,000 people attended the three-day event at the new Kleberg County Park. The chief said an effort to get big name entertainment would be made for the following year. There were 22 entries in the pinto bean cookoff with Rudy Herrera of Rudy's Trim Shop taking first place. Higinio Gonzalez of Robstown took second place. Mayor Gilbert Acuna came in third and Mario Salazar took fourth. Miss

Vicky Luna, 17, of Alice was crowned queen and handed out the trophies. Spectators from as far away as London, England were there to witness first hand such events as the ja-Kingsville Police Association estimated that it made \$2,000 on the festival.

Meanwhile, burglaries in Kingsville had almost doubled in a year. But the rate of solving those crimes was up slightly. The burglaries of homes were the same as the previous year, however, it was the burglaries of businesses that was on the rise. There had been 145 business burglaries in 1975 as compared to 73 the same time the previous year.

The Columbian Ladies

of Council 2623 had celebrated their 12th anniversary back in June with a dance at the K.C. Hall on 14th street. The Rev. John McGrath, pastor of St. Martins Catholic Church, installed new officers and awards were presented to 18 members who received charter membership certificates. Mrs. Arturo Ramirez was named outstanding member of the Columbian Ladies.

Kingsville Record re-porter, Gloria Bigger wrote feature story on Miguel Muniz, a King Ranch Cowboy who was still practicing a trade that was almost extinct. Muniz made horses' leads, hackamores bridle reins, saddle girths and quirts. He made riding equipment with hair taken from a horse's mane or tail and had been doing it on a full-time basis since 1940. Muniz had lived on the King Ranch since 1917.

the Kingsville Swimming Pool on the Texas A&I East Campus. Johnson represented Mack's Chicken Shack in the pageant. An estimated 1,500 persons attended the event.

#### July 1926



### **Summary:**

The Kingsville Fire Department has the opportunity to apply for a grant from the Ed Rachal Foundation for the purchase of new EMS training equipment.

### **Background:**

The Kingsville Fire Department (KFD) is dedicated to ensuring our personnel are trained and equipped to meet the needs of the community. Having modern state-of-the-art training equipment is crucial in meeting the mission of the Fire Department. Funding from the Ed Rachal Foundation grant will be used to purchase two new life size training manikins (one adult, one child size) that will be used for multiple skills and scenario-based training exercises. The funding will also be used to purchase a training monitor and corresponding software that will allow instructors to monitor and provide real-time feedback for personnel during simulation type training exercises. These exercises will improve and refine life-saving skills including CPR, fluid therapy and airway management. The application will request \$28,790.00 for these costs.

### Financial Impact:

The Ed Rachal Foundation grant does not require a matching cost share. The grant is a reimbursement type grant. We are requesting a total of \$28,790.00 for the purchase of equipment and associated shipping and handling charges.

# **Purpose:**

We are seeking approval to award the eighth GLO CDBG-MIT Hurricane Harvey State Mitigation Competition Round 1 grant. Project 14 – E. Santa Gertrudis Ave. Storm Water Improvements is a critical component of the city's flood management infrastructure upgrades. This project includes the installation of 2,965 linear feet of reinforced concrete culvert, 14 inlets, 5,343 SY of asphalt and related appurtenances to improve stormwater drainage and reduce future flood risks. The project will be completed within 360 consecutive calendar days after giving the Notice to Proceed.

# **Summary:**

This project was advertised in the local newspaper on June 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> and city's website. Sealed bids for Bid No. 25-17 (Project 14) were received prior to the deadline of July 8, 2025, at 2:00pm and read out loud, from five bidders:

- 1. D&J Utility Services LLC, Aransas Pass, TX 78335
- 2. RS Parker Construction LLC, Corpus Christi, TX 78408
- 3. White Star Services LLC, Corpus Christi, TX 78415
- 4. D&M Underground Corp., Corpus Christi, TX 78418
- 5. Grace Paving and Construction Inc., Corpus Christi, TX 78405

The base bids range from \$1,110,141.86 to \$1,800,510.00. Alternate No. 1 bids range from \$8,020.10 to \$21,423.00. The total bids range from \$1,118,161.96 to \$1,809,623.84. After review, staff recommends awarding the project to the lowest bidder, Grace Paving and Construction Inc., for the total base bid amount of \$1,118,161.96. Also, the bid is 38% below the engineer's estimate which is considered reasonable.



# **Background:**

The General Land Office (GLO) awarded \$36,311,929.00 to the City of Kingsville for citywide drainage improvements on May 21, 2021. Texas Land Commissioner George P. Bush announced over \$46 million in flood mitigation projects to improve drainage infrastructure in Kleberg County and the City of Kingsville. These projects will benefit thousands of residents in low-to-moderate income (LMI) areas that have experienced repeated storm damage, including during Hurricane Harvey in 2017.

The City of Kingsville amended its Drainage Master Plan in 2020 to include five additional sites, covering all areas of the city. External funding is necessary to complete these improvements, which will bolster community resilience by reducing flood-related economic losses, protecting public infrastructure, and preserving emergency response capabilities.

These drainage improvements will efficiently direct stormwater from residential and commercial areas to outflows leading to Santa Gertrudis Creek, San Fernando Creek, and ultimately Baffin Bay. The improvements include:

- Installation of 9,000 feet of reinforced concrete pipe and 23,100 feet of culverts with 130 added inlets
- 65 junction boxes and 6,900 feet of curb and gutter to drain water from road surfaces
- Surface repairs using flex base with geogrid for soil stabilization, with either a 4-inch hot mix asphalt or concrete pavement surface
- Replacement of impacted sidewalks for pedestrian safety
- Installation of concrete headwalls at drainage pipe and culvert ends to prevent erosion

# Financial Impact:

Project 14 will be funded by the General Land Office Hurricane Harvey Mitigation Grant (Fund 122) in the amount of \$1,118,161.96.

### **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends awarding CDBG-MIT GLO Contract No. 22-085-009-D237 – Project 14 (E. Santa Gertrudis Ave. Storm Water Improvements) to Grace Paving and Construction Inc., for the total base bid amount of \$1,118,161.96.

# **Background:**

We are seeking approval to award the seventh GLO CDBG-MIT Hurricane Harvey State Mitigation Competition Round 1 grant. Project 10-N. Armstrong St. Storm Water Improvements is a critical component of the city's flood management infrastructure upgrades. This project includes the installation of 310 linear feet of reinforced concrete culvert, 15 curb inlets with throat extension, and related appurtenances to improve stormwater drainage and reduce future flood risks. The project will be completed within 180 consecutive calendar days after given the Notice to Proceed.

This project was advertised in the local newspaper on February 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> and city's website. Sealed bids for Bid No. 25-13 (Project 10) were received prior to the deadline of March 18, 2025, at 2:00pm and read out loud, from three bidders:

- 1. D&J Utility Services LLC, Sinton, Texas
- 2. Mor-Will LLC, Mission, Texas
- 3. CK Newberry LLC, Karnes City, Texas

The base bids range from \$489,400.00 to \$1,097,565.00. Alternate No. 1 bids range from \$453,918.00 to \$655,019.40. The total bids range from \$1,087,748.00 to \$1,551,483,00. After review, staff recommends awarding the project to the lowest bidder, D&J Utility Services LLC, for the total base bid amount of \$1,087,748.00. Also, the bid is 17% below the engineer's estimate which is considered reasonable.

# Financial Impact:

Change Order No. 1 will be funded by the General Land Office Hurricane Harvey Mitigation Grant (Fund 122) in the amount of \$51,176.84.



# **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends approving the Change Order No. 1 for CDBG-MIT GLO Contract No. 22-085-009-D237 – Project 10 (N. Armstrong St. Storm Water Improvements) for the additional amount of \$51,176.84 and increased 20 calendar days.

This memorandum is in reference to ICE's recommendation to Change Order 1, in the amount of \$51,176.84. The Change Order is to add pavement striping and markings to N. Armstrong St. From W. Corral Ave. to W. Santa Gertrudis St. The striping plan will consist of north and south travel lanes, a designated left turn lane, bicycle lanes, crosswalks, and appropriate goring compliant with all current standards.

ICE has reviewed the proposal and agree that the costs of the new contract items are within a reasonable difference of the Engineer's estimate and within industry averages.

Additionally, D & J Utility Services, LLC requests a time extension of 20 days. ICE recommends a 20-day extension to allow for mobilization and execution of the additional items.

This Change Order 1 will increase the original contract amount of \$1,087,788.00 by approximately <u>4.7%</u>, which falls within the 25% allowance per the GLO contract. The adjusted contract amount with this change order will be \$1,138,964.84.

Therefore, it is ICE's recommendation to approve Change Order 1. The City of Kingsville has the final decision to approve/not approve change orders.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Kingsville (City) intends to make some storm water improvements through a General Land Office (GLO) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) -Mitigation (MIT) Program via Contract #22-085-009-D237 Project 10: N. Armstrong Ave. Storm Water Improvements (from Corral Ave. to Santa Gertrudis Ave.) and went out for bids via Bid #25-13 which was advertised on February 13<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025;

**WHEREAS**, the three bids were received by the March 18, 2025 deadline that were responsive to Bid #25-13 and after reviewing the bid submittals staff and the outside engineer (ICE) recommended the bid be awarded to the low bidder, which was D&J Utility Services LLC, from Sinton, Texas (Vendor);

**WHEREAS**, the City awarded Bid#25-13 to Vendor at a Commission meeting on April 14, 2025 for a total amount of \$1,087,788.00 and 180 consecutive calendar days from the Notice to Proceed;

WHEREAS, the City and Vendor worked to prepare a contract for GLO CDBG-MIT Contract No. 22-085-009-D237 Project 10: N. Armstrong Ave. Storm Water Improvements and the parties both agree to the terms of the proposed contract for the base bid (\$489,440.00) and for alternate no. 1 (\$598,348.00), which together is a total amount of \$1,087,788.00 and 180 calendar days, and approved the contract on April 28, 2025 via Resolution #2025-47;

**WHEREAS**, it is recommended that additional work to include traffic control upgrades for motorists and non-motorists be done to enhance public safety that will result in an additional \$51,176.84 and 20 calendar days;

**WHEREAS**, staff is recommending the City Commission approve Change Order #1 for the construction contract with vendor as presented for a total amount of \$1,138,964.84 with a contract time of 200 calendar days;
