
Financial Impact:



FY2026 Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Vehicles Grant

Summary:

The Police Department respectfully requests the City Commission to consider a resolution allowing the Police Department to apply for the Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Vehicles Grant provided by the Office of the Governor Public Safety Office.

Background:

The Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Grant, authorized under Texas House Bill 2217, aims to enhance officer safety by providing funding for bullet-resistant components such as windshields, side windows, rear windows, and door panels that meet or exceed National Institute of Justice (NIJ) Level IIIA protection standards. This protective gear is essential for the safety of our officers as they carry out their duties.

Financial Impact:

The Police Department requests to apply for the grant to acquire the bullet-resistant components needed. The total cost to equip our units amounts to \$420,000.00. This grant does not require a 50% match and is completely grant funded. This investment is crucial for ensuring the continued safety and protection of our officers as they perform their duties.

Recommendation:

We request a resolution to allow for the application of this grant by the Chief of Police and staff.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Kingsville, Texas:

Dear Mr. Cardenas,

This memorandum is in reference to ICE's recommendation to Change Order 2, in the amount of \$11,860.00. This change order addresses conflicts discovered during construction such as sanitary sewer manhole lids that could not be opened for CCTV inspection of the sewer lines undergoing cast-in-place piping rehabilitation. These manhole lids have been corroded beyond repair and will be needing replacement.

Additionally, an abandoned 18" Ø well was discovered in the established project area, within existing parameters of the proposed lift station dry well. This will require cutting and abandonment before the lift station site can be excavated safely.

This Change Order 2 along with Change Order 1 will <u>decrease</u> the original contract amount of \$2,593,299.15 by approximately <u>0.95%</u>, which falls within the 18% allowance per the GLO contract. The adjusted contract amount with this and previous change orders will be \$2,568,744.45. ICE has reviewed the contractor's change order proposal items (CO 2-1 through CO 2-4) and has verified that the new contract items are reasonably priced and within average market value.


A 90-day construction contract extension is also required due to the delay in ordering and installing new materials for manhole ring and cover replacement before CCTV inspection can be performed.


Therefore, it is ICE's recommendation to approve Change Order 2. The City of Kingsville has the final decision to approve/not approve change orders.



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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF KINGSVILLE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE CHANGE ORDER NO.2 FOR A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH DONALD HUBERT CONSTRUCTION CO. FOR PROJECT 1:14TH ST. SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT OF THE CDBG-MIT PROGRAM GLO STATE CONTRACT NUMBER 22-082-016-D218.

WHEREAS, the City of Kingsville has applied for and received a Community Development Block Grant-Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) award to provide Flood & Drainage Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City advertised for Project 1: 14th Street Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project (Bid #24-09) in the newspaper, on the City's website, with Historically Underutilized Business, and with Minority-and Women-Owned Business Enterprises, in the time period required by law, prior to the April 18, 2024 bid opening; and

WHEREAS, the City received three bids by the April 18, 2024 bid deadline and the City Commission awarded the bid to the lowest bidder (Donald Hubert Construction Co.) on August 26, 2024 contingent on the GLO's approval of a pending amendment request;

WHEREAS, the contract could not be executed because the amendment included revisions to this particular project site and the state contract amendment was not able to be fully executed until January 31, 2025;

WHEREAS, the winning bidder was then contacted to see if their bid was still valid and they confirmed that their bid is still valid;

WHEREAS, the an updated general wage decision for this project was also issued by the Labor Standards Officer on March 17, 2025, so the City is now moving forward with the contract award recommendation for Donald Hubert Construction Co. with a proposed start date of May 5, 2025 and an expected completion date of December 30, 2025 for the base bid and addenda 1&2 for a total contract price of \$2,593,299.15;

WHEREAS, the City and Donald Hubert Construction Co. negotiated a contract for the construction services, which was approved by City Commission via Resolution #2025-38 on April 14, 2025;

WHEREAS, the contract was amended on July 14, 2025 via Resolution #2025-67, which authorized approval of Change Order No. 1 that was needed to modify three things in the scope of work and decrease the contract price by \$36,414.70 with no change in contract time;

WHEREAS, it is now proposed that the contract be amended again via Change Order No.2 to address unforeseen issues during construction, which will increase the contract price by \$11,860.00 and increase the contract time by 90 days:

WHEREAS, it is mutually deemed sound, desirable, practicable, and beneficial for the parties to enter into the agreement attached hereto.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Kingsville, Texas as follows:

Sec. 3-13-37. - Structure of the ethics review board.

- (A) *Establishment.* There is hereby established an Ethics Review Board, which shall have the powers and duties specified in this subarticle.
- (B) Composition. The Ethics Review Board shall consist of five members. The Mayor and each member of the City Commission shall nominate one member of the Board. Each nominee must be confirmed by a majority of City Commission members. Nomination and confirmation of Board members shall be conducted at separate open meetings of the City Commission.
- (C) *Terms of office.* Board members shall be appointed to two-year terms. Initial appointments shall be made so that terms are staggered. No member shall serve for more than three two-year terms.
- (D) *Qualifications*. Members of the Board shall have good moral character and shall be residents of the city. No member of the Board shall be:
 - (1) A salaried city official or employee;
 - (2) An elected public official;
 - (3) A candidate for elected public office;
 - (4) An officer of a political party;
 - (5) A parent, spouse, child, or other relative within the second degree of consanguinity or affinity of an elected public official; or
 - (6) A lobbyist required to register under §§ 3-13-22 through 3-13-31.
- (E) Removal. Members of the Ethics Review Board may be removed from office for cause by a majority of the City Commission only after a public hearing at which the member was provided with the opportunity to be heard. Grounds for removal include: failure to satisfy, or to continue to satisfy, the qualifications set forth in division (D); substantial neglect of duty; gross misconduct in office; inability to discharge the powers or duties of office; or violation of any provision in this Code of Ethics.
- (F) *Vacancies.* A vacancy shall be filled by a person who will serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. The appointment shall made by the member of City Commission who is entitled to make appointments to the seat that was vacated, and must be confirmed by a majority of the City Commission.
- (G) Recusal.
 - (1) A member of the Ethics Review Board shall recuse himself or herself from any case in which, because of familial relationship, employment, investments, or otherwise, his or her impartiality might reasonably be questioned. A Board member may not participate in official action on any complaint:
 - (a) That the member initiated;

- (b) That involves the member of City Commission who nominated him or her for a seat on the Ethics Review Board; or
- (c) During the pendency of an indictment or information charging the member with an offense, or after a finding of guilt of such an offense.
- (2) If the number of Board members who are recused from a case is so large that an Ethics Panel cannot be constituted, as provided for in § 3-13-41, the Mayor shall nominate a sufficient number of ad hoc members so that the case can be heard. Ad hoc members of the Ethics Review Board must be confirmed by a majority vote of the City Commission and serve only for the case in question.
- (H) Chair and vice-chair. Each year, the Board shall meet and elect a chair and a vice-chair from among its members, who will serve one-year terms and may be re-elected. The chair or a majority of the Board may call a meeting of the Board. The chair shall preside at meetings of the Ethics Review Board and perform other administrative duties. The vice-chair shall assume the duties of the chair in the event of a vacancy in that position.
- (l) *Reimbursement.* The members of the Ethics Review Board shall not be compensated but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.


